PIANO SECTION SPECIFIC RULES - 2023

Please also read the General Rules for Festival, all of which apply here.

1. CLASSES

- **Competitive:** Eligible for awards.
- **Non-competitive:** Not eligible for awards
- **Adult:** Competitive and non-competitive classes
- Each participant must pay a registration fee of \$10.00 to the Quesnel Festival of the Performing Arts.

2. ENTRIES

Actual, accurate playing time must be stated on the entry form.

Please give **Time in Minutes**. This is for the purpose of planning the program. Teachers are asked to comply with this rule.

Participants must enter all classes at the performance level according to guidelines laid out by the following syllabi or books, unless otherwise stated in this syllabus:

Note: Adjudicator-graded pieces are also acceptable

- Selections from a higher grade or performance level must be entered in the appropriate Repertoire Class.
- Beginning at the Grade 1 level, competitors may enter that grade and any higher grade for two successive calendar years, regardless of their exam results.
- 2023 due to the festival being cancelled that last few years. Performers may have some favourite pieces from those years that they wish to perform. During this festival students may enter pieces that may not be found in the syllabus. **BE SURE TO HAVE THE ORIGINAL COPY. NO PHOTO COPIES WILL BE EXCEPTED**
- Note if the piece is not in the syllabus I will need a copy sent to my email so that the adjudicator may see them in advance. (daniellecarter23@hotmail.com)
- If the participant wishes to enter a piece AT A LOWER or HIGHER LEVEL that is not included in the above Syllabus list they may do so. (**PLEASE BE AWARE THAT THESE MAY NOT BE ABLE TO QUALIFY TOWARD ANY PROVINCIAL QUALIFICATIONS**)
- All pieces must be put in their correct class according to the piano syllabus
- If the Participant has entered more than one song in the same class it may be put into concert group setting.

3. MUSIC

- It is strongly recommended that solo participants perform from memory, as this is a consideration when marks are awarded. If you have not memorized your music, you must have an original piece of music to play from (as well as the one you provide for the adjudicator).
- Participants may not enter the same selection in successive years.
- **All participants must bring to the performance an original copy of each piece of music for the adjudicator's use. THIS APPLIES TO DUETS AND ENSEMBLES AS WELL; be certain you can obtain sufficient original copies for use by performers and adjudicator.**
- Competitors presenting themselves without music will be allowed to play for adjudication only.
- **No photocopies permitted. Original music must be handed to the secretary at the check in. Music downloaded from the internet must be accompanied by a receipt (separate receipt for each copy) and the music must be presented to the secretary for approval at least 15 minutes prior to the beginning of the class.**
- Competitors presenting at a class with photocopied music will be disqualified for that class.

- Music is to be marked with the participant's name.
- Bar numbers at beginnings of lines must be indicated on the music.

4. PERFORMANCE and CONDUCT

- In the interest of fair competition, Festival piano or facility may not be used (either by students or teachers) for rehearsal or practice purposes during the Festival.
- Competitors must report to the Check-in desk at the performance venue at least 15 minutes prior to the scheduled class commencement time.
- Participants who fail to appear for their classes forfeit their right to perform.
- **Each competitor is requested to announce the titles and composers of their pieces before performing.**
- No admittance will be allowed once a performance has commenced and absolute silence must prevail during each performance.
- No preschoolers will be allowed in the performance hall unless they are performing.
- **Knowledge of stage decorum, suitable dress and courtesy to fellow performers are all part of the festival experience. Teachers and parents are urged to encourage contestants to become acquainted with this. The Festival Committee strongly suggests that students DO NOT wear blue jeans, and/or runners, and that hair be tied back from the face, as this is taken into consideration in the overall performance.**
- Competitors are expected to be present for the entire class and are requested to wait for the Adjudicator's signal before beginning.
- After performing, competitors shall sit in the first row of the performance hall in readiness for the class adjudication.
- Participants should be prepared to perform at the Finale concert if requested.

5. BURSARIES, AWARDS and SCHOLARSHIPS

- A number of bursaries, awards and scholarships are made available each year to encourage and assist worthy entrants. To be eligible for any of these, the competitor must have been recommended for the award by the adjudicator, and have entered the festival competitively.
- All competitive entrants of the Quesnel Festival of the Performing Arts are eligible for the festival trophies, certificates and awards.
- A number of trophies are awarded for Solo & Ensemble performances and should be awarded to performers with silver or gold standing. It is recommended that a performer receive one trophy only – in order to encourage a larger number of participants, rather than a limited few. When there isn't a qualified trophy recipient, trophies do not have to be awarded.
- All awards are not automatically awarded. These are at the discretion of the adjudicator and are not solely dependent on marks and/or entry in any particular class, but are based on overall performance.
- Piano marks will be made available to teachers upon request to the Piano Director.
- Competitors must perform a minimum of 2 SOLOS **in different classes**, which may be chosen from any class except: Sight Reading, Quick Study, Diverse Styles, or Ensembles. Concert Group entries will be eligible for the Concert Group Trophy only. Senior grades (4 and up) are encouraged to enter more than 2 pieces. Provincial Regulations are as follows: Grade 7 to ARTC, two contrasting selections **FOR A MAXIMUM TIME LIMIT OF 15 MINUTES** (age 14 and under), **20 MINUTES** (age 17 and under), **25 MINUTES** (age 28 and under). Time limits are given as an aid to the competitor to understand the amount of material expected at this level.
- Concerto marks may be used as one of the qualifying marks provided it meets the standard of difficulty for the grade level as outlined by the Syllabus.
- **Only one medal may be presented per participant regardless of how many pieces may have been played by that performer in the Class**
- **THE DECISION OF THE ADJUDICATOR IS FINAL.**

6. VOLUNTEERS

- All parents' names will be put on a volunteer list and each will be asked to donate two or more hours of time helping with the Festival. Please plan to have some free time set aside during the piano festival days that you may be available for volunteering. If you are unavailable to volunteer you will be asked to find a replacement volunteer to fill your position.

ENSEMBLE CLASSES

One selection, which may be any of the following: Piano Duo (2 piano, 4 hands), Duet (1 piano, 4 hands) Trio, Quartet, Family. Duet class consists of two melodic lines, not two instruments played in unison. Student ensemble must enter the class that corresponds with the grade level of the highest level participant. State the name and grade levels of all performers on the entry form. **Piano duo entry is available upon permission from the piano committee – dependent on availability of 2nd piano rental.**

It is not a requirement that the duets be memorized. In the case that the duet isn't memorized there must be two original copies of the music present at the time of performance, one for the competitor(s) and the other for the adjudicator.

Ensemble Time Limit: 15 minutes. If wishing to perform for longer than 15 minutes, then an extra fee of \$20.00 per additional 15 minute increment (or portion thereof) must be paid.

ORIGINAL COMPOSITION

Gr. 3 & up: An original composition of at least 24 bars for any piano or any combination of pianos.

Pre Gr.1 – Gr. 2: Minimum of 8 bars.

ENTRY: A student may enter more than one composition. A separate entry form is required for each composition along with the appropriate entry fee. **The Festival Office must receive Manuscript three weeks prior to the first day of the Piano Festival. If the composition is not handed in on time the entry may be disqualified.** The composition may be performed if desired, but the performance will not be adjudicated.

The student composers are encouraged to write a story that explains their musical ideas in their composition.

MANUSCRIPT: Original composition must be written on manuscript paper in BLACK INK or done with a computer program. Each entry MUST be the original work of the individual whose name appears on the entry form. The composer will retain all rights to the original work. The Festival Committee reserves the right to have any original compositions performed at the Festival.

Please keep in mind that it is the written music that is being marked not how you play it. If it is written incorrectly this may result in a lower mark regardless of how you play.

MUSICAL ENSEMBLE

Entrants may perform 2 or more selections, presenting an opportunity to share multiple learned musical skills. Piano must be one of the selections entered with the addition of performing one or more other instruments (including voice, and speech).

Two people for the front desk, check in Table

- Check in each performer.
- Confirm that each performer has their music and that it is free of pencil markings.
- Collect each performers music and put post it notes on the book and page that the performers song is in. These book are then put in order and handed to the Adjudicator secretary.
- Make sure no photocopy rules are broken. If the performer has purchased their music through the internet they must show a receipt.
- Remind people that entrance is by donation.

Adjudicator Secretary

- Read off the performance rules before classes.
- Introduce each class and call up performers.
- Hand the adjudicator the performers music before each performance.
- Make sure that the adjudication sheet for the adjudicator to write on is with the music before the performer starts.
- After the the class in done playing and while the adjudicator is adjudicating set up each certificate with the proper seal (Bronze, Silver, Gold) this would be decided by the marks written down by the adjudicator.
- This job is very important as the adjudicator secretary must keep the marks confidential.
- This job is a lot of fun and you will get to hear many amazing performances.

Adjudicator drivers

- Drivers that bring the adjudicator back and forth from hotel to festival venue and out for lunch/supper breaks.
